**PROPOSED DECLARATION OF FINAL DIVIDEND;
PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS;

REPURCHASE SHARES AND TO ISSUE SHARES**

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting which include, among other matters, the approval of the (i) declaration of final dividend; (ii) re-election of Directors; and (iii) granting of the Repurchase Mandate and the Issuance Mandate.

2. PROPOSED DECLARATION OF FINAL DIVIDEND

As mentioned in the annual results announcement of the Company dated 30 March 2020, the Board recommended the payment of a final dividend of HK\$0.02 per Share for the year ended 31 December 2019. The proposed final dividend will be paid out of the Share Premium Account to the Shareholders whose names appear on the register of members of the Company on Thursday, 4 June 2020, subject to the approval of the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting and compliance with the Companies Law.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Under section 34(2) of the Companies Law, the share premium account may be applied by a company in paying dividends to members provided that no dividend may be paid to members out of the share premium account unless, immediately following the date on which the dividend is proposed to be paid, the company shall be able to pay its debts as they fall due in the ordinary course of business. The Board confirms that with respect to the payment of the proposed final dividend out of the Share Premium Account, the Company shall be able to pay its debts as they fall due in the ordinary course of business immediately following the date on which the final dividend is proposed to be paid.

The final dividend is intended to be entirely paid out of the Share Premium Account pursuant to Article 24.6 of the Articles of Association and in accordance with the Companies Law.

For determining the entitlement to the proposed final dividend (subject to approval by the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting), the register of members of the Company will be closed from Tuesday, 2 June 2020 to Thursday, 4 June 2020, both dates inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered. In order to qualify for the proposed final dividend, unregistered holders of Shares shall ensure that all transfer documents accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at Level 54, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Monday, 1 June 2020 (Hong Kong time).

3. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with Article 16.18 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Zheng Yi, Mr. Ren Yuhang and Mr. Bai Jinrong shall retire at the Annual General Meeting. All of the above Directors, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

The nomination committee of the Company recommends to the Board for the proposal for re-election of Mr. Bai Jinrong as an independent non-executive Director after considering the potential contribution that he can bring to the Board in terms of his qualification, skills and experience, and various factors including but not limited to gender, age, cultural, educational background and professional qualifications as set out in the Board diversity policy of the Company. Further, Mr. Bai Jinrong, being an independent non-executive Director, has given an annual confirmation of independence pursuant to the independence guidelines as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. The Board is of the view that he remains to be independent after assessing his independence in accordance with the independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. The Board believes that Mr. Bai Jinrong possesses legal professional experience which can contribute to diversity of the Board. The Board also believes that Mr. Bai Jinrong has the required character, integrity and experience to fulfill and discharge the roles and duties of an independent non-executive Director and recommends that Mr. Bai Jinrong should be re-elected as independent non-executive Director at the Annual General Meeting.

Details of the Directors proposed for re-election at the Annual General Meeting are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

4. PROPOSED GRANTING OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 25 June 2019, a general mandate was granted to the Directors to repurchase Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. In order to give the Company the flexibility to repurchase Shares if and when appropriate, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to approve the granting of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange of not exceeding 10% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of the proposed ordinary resolution at the Annual General Meeting (i.e. a total of 210,012,672 Shares on the basis that the number of issued Shares of 2,100,126,727 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date remains unchanged on the date of the Annual General Meeting). The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to repurchase any Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the granting of the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

5. PROPOSED GRANTING OF THE ISSUANCE MANDATE

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 25 June 2019, a general mandate was granted to the Directors to issue Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. In order to give the Company the flexibility to issue Shares if and when appropriate, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to approve the granting of the Issuance Mandate to the Directors to allot, issue or deal with additional Shares of not exceeding 20% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of the proposed ordinary resolution at the Annual General Meeting (i.e. a total of 420,025,345 Shares on the basis that the number of issued Shares of 2,100,126,727 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date remains unchanged on the date of the Annual General Meeting). An ordinary resolution to extend the Issuance Mandate by adding the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate will also be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to issue any new Shares pursuant to the Issuance Mandate.

6. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

The notice of the Annual General Meeting is set out on pages 15 to 19 of this circular.

Pursuant to the Listing Rules and the Articles of Association, any vote of Shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman decides to allow a resolution relating to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. An announcement on the poll results will be published by the Company after the Annual General Meeting in the manner prescribed under the Listing Rules.

A form of proxy for use at the Annual General Meeting is enclosed with this circular and such form of proxy is also published on the websites of Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited (www.hkexnews.hk) and the Company (www.biitt.cn). To be valid, the form of proxy must be completed and signed in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and deposited, together with the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power of attorney or authority at the Company's branch share registrar in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at Level 54, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong as soon as possible but in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting (i.e. not later than 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, 24 May 2020, Hong Kong time) or the adjourned meeting (as the case may be). Completion and delivery of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting at the Annual General Meeting if you so wish and, in such event, the instrument appointing a proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

7. RECOMMENDATION

(1) Mr. Zheng Yi

ZHENG Yi (鄭毅), Mr. Zheng, aged 45, was appointed as a non-executive Director on 25 August 2017. Mr. Zheng obtained a Master's degree in engineering, specialised in Road and Railway Engineering, at the School of Civil Engineering of Northern Jiaotong University (now known as Beijing Jiaotong University) in May 2000. He was qualified as a senior engineer by Beijing Senior Specialised Technique Qualification Evaluation Committee (北京市高級專業技術資格評審委員會) in July 2006 and was subsequently qualified as a professor-grade senior engineer in 2017. Since November 2005, he once took up various positions in BII, the ultimate holding company of the Company, as the senior planner and deputy manager, Head of office of railway routing consolidation department of BII, general manager of preliminary planning department, and assistant general manager of BII and general manager of railway transportation business department.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Zheng does not hold any other position in the Company or other members of the Group nor does he have any other relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling Shareholders. Mr. Zheng does not at present nor has he in the past three years held any directorship in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Mr. Zheng has signed a letter of appointment with the Company as non-executive Director for a term of three years commencing from 25 August 2017, which may be terminated by the Company by giving not less than three months' notice in writing. Mr. Zheng is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at least once every three years at the annual general meeting in accordance with the Articles of Association. Under the letter of appointment, Mr. Zheng is entitled to reimbursement of all reasonable out-of-pocket expenses properly incurred in relation to the discharge of his duties to the Company provided that the amount of total reimbursement each year shall not exceed HK\$240,000.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Zheng did not have any interests in the Shares or underlying Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no information which is discloseable nor is Mr. Zheng involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements under Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters concerning Mr. Zheng that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

(2) Mr. Ren Yuhang

REN Yuhang (任宇航), Mr. Ren, aged 44, was appointed as a non-executive Director on 28 February 2017. Mr. Ren obtained a bachelor's degree in thermal engineering from Wuhan University in June 1996. He also obtained a master's degree in technology economics and management and a doctorate's degree in business administration from Beijing Institute of Technology in June 2004 and March 2008, respectively. From July 1996 to September 2003, Mr. Ren worked at Henan No. 1 Electrical Power Company (河南省電力公司火電一公司) as an engineer. From September 2004 to September 2005, he worked for the Credit Management Authority of China Development Bank. From September 2005 to June 2006, he took the position of manager at the research department of Beijing Boxing Investment Consultancy Company Limited (北京博星投資顧問有限公司). From May to September 2007, he worked as a senior consultant at the business consulting department of INNOFI Financial Information Industry Group (北京正信嘉華管理顧問有限公司). Mr. Ren has worked as a project manager, senior project manager and general manager of the financial planning department of BII since September 2007. Mr. Ren is currently the board secretary and the general manager of investment development headquarters of BII, the ultimate holding company of the Company. Mr. Ren was appointed as the director of BII HK, a controlling shareholder of the Company, in July 2015. Mr. Ren was appointed as a director of Beijing Traffic Control Technology Co., Ltd, a company listed on the Shanghai Stock Exchange on July 2019 (stock code: 688015), in March 2017 and appointed as non-executive director of Beijing Urban Construction Design & Development Group Co., Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 1599), in August 2018. Mr. Ren was appointed as the director of Suzhou Huaqi Intelligent Technology Co., Ltd. (蘇州華啟智能科技有限公司) with effect from 28 February 2019, the vice chairman of Shaoxing Jingyue Metro Co., Ltd.* (紹興京越地鐵有限公司) with effect from April 2019, a director of Huangshan Region Travel Metro Investment Development Co., Ltd* (黃山市市域旅遊鐵路投資發展有限公司) with effect from August 2019 and the executive director of BII Investment Co., Ltd* (北京京投投資控股有限公司) with effect from November 2019.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Ren does not hold any other position in the Company or other members of the Group nor does he have any other relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling Shareholders. Mr. Ren does not at present nor has he in the past three years held any directorship in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Mr. Ren has signed a letter of appointment with the Company as non-executive Director for a term of three years commencing from 28 February 2020, which may be terminated by the Company by giving not less than three months' notice in writing. Mr. Ren is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at least once every three years at the annual general meeting in accordance with the Articles of Association. Under the letter of appointment, Mr. Ren is entitled to reimbursement of all reasonable out-of-pocket expenses properly incurred in relation to the discharge of his duties to the Company provided that the amount of total reimbursement each year shall not exceed HK\$240,000.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Ren did not have any interests in the Shares or underlying Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

(3) Mr. Bai Jinrong

BAI Jinrong (白金榮), Mr. Bai, aged 69, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director on 7 December 2011. Mr. Bai is also the chairman of the Remuneration Committee and member of the Audit Committee and the Nomination Committee. Mr. Bai graduated from Beijing Normal University in 1985. Mr. Bai has over 30 years of experience in economics, finance and enterprise management. From 1984 to 1992, Mr. Bai served as a deputy director and director of the Policy Research Office of Beijing Chemical Industry Group. From 1992 to 1997, Mr. Bai served as a deputy director of Beijing Economic Structure Reforms Committee (北京市經濟體制改革委員會). From 2003 to 2004, Mr. Bai was the deputy director of Beijing State-owned Assets Supervision and Administration Commission. From 2005 to 2010, Mr. Bai was the vice board chairman and general manager of Beijing Enterprises Group Company Limited. From June 2005 to June 2011, Mr. Bai was the executive director of Beijing Enterprises Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 392). From February 2015 to March 2016, Mr. Bai also served as the independent non-executive director of Shi Shi Services Limited (formerly known as Kong Shum Union Property Management (Holding) Limited and Heng Sheng Holdings Limited), a company listed on GEM of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 8181).

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Bai does not hold any other position in the Company or other members of the Group nor does he have any other relationship with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling Shareholders. Mr. Bai does not at present nor has he in the past three years held any directorship in other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Mr. Bai has signed a letter of appointment with the Company as independent non-executive Director for a term of three years commencing from 16 May 2018, which may be terminated by the Company by giving not less than three months' notice in writing. Mr. Bai is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at least once every three years at the annual general meeting in accordance with the Articles of Association. Under the letter of appointment, Mr. Bai is entitled to a director's fee of HK\$240,000 per annum which was determined by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibility with the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Bai did not have any interests in the Shares or underlying Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no information which is discloseable nor is Mr. Bai involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements under Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters concerning Mr. Bai that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting in relation to the granting of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASE OF SECURITIES

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their shares on the Stock Exchange or any other stock exchange on which the securities of the company are listed and such exchange is recognised by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong subject to certain restrictions. Among such restrictions, the Listing Rules provide that the shares of such company must be fully paid up and all repurchase of shares by such company must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of shareholders, either by way of a general mandate or by specific approval of a particular transaction.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 2,100,126,727 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution in respect of the granting of the Repurchase Mandate at the Annual General Meeting and on the basis that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged on the date of the Annual General Meeting, i.e. being 2,100,126,727 Shares, the Directors would be authorized under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase, during the period in which the Repurchase Mandate remains in force, a total of 210,012,672 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of the Annual General Meeting.

3. REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the granting of the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

Shares repurchase may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

4. FUNDING OF SHARE REPURCHASE

The Company may only apply funds legally available for share repurchase in accordance with its Memorandum, the Articles of Association, the Companies Law and other applicable laws of the Cayman Islands, as the case may be.

5. IMPACT OF SHARE REPURCHASE

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2019) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

7. GENERAL

To the best of their knowledge and having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor any of their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the granting of the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

To the best knowledge of the Company, as at the Latest Practicable Date, BII HK was interested in 1,157,634,900 Shares representing approximately 55.12% of the total issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors exercise the proposed Repurchase Mandate in full, the shareholding of BII HK would be increased to approximately 61.25% of the issued share capital of the Company. The Directors are not aware of any consequences which may give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

The Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code and/or result in the aggregate number of Shares held by the public shareholders falling below the prescribed minimum percentage required by the Stock Exchange.
