INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide Shareholders with the notice of Annual General Meeting and information regarding the following proposals to be put forward at the Annual General Meeting: (i) the grant to the Directors of the General Mandate to issue Shares, the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase Shares and the Extension Mandate; (ii) the re-election of the Directors; and (iii) the declaration of a final dividend and a special dividend.

GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

In order to ensure greater flexibility and give discretion to the Directors in the event that it becomes desirable for the Company to issue new Shares, approval is to be sought from the Shareholders, pursuant to the Listing Rules, for the General Mandate to issue Shares. The ordinary resolution no. 5(A) as stated in the Notice will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to grant to the Directors the General Mandate to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and deal with new Shares in the share capital of the Company up to 20 per cent of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the resolution in relation to the General Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 400,000,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the above ordinary resolution and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased after the Latest Practicable Date and up to the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to issue a maximum of 80,000,000 Shares.

REPURCHASE MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

In addition, an ordinary resolution no. 5(B) as stated in the Notice will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares representing up to 10 per cent of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the resolution in relation to the Repurchase Mandate.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules in connection with the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix II to this circular. This explanatory statement contains all information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolution at the Annual General Meeting.

EXTENSION MANDATE

Subject to a separate approval of the ordinary resolution no. 5(C) as stated in the Notice, the number of Shares purchased by the Company under ordinary resolution no. 5(B) as stated in the Notice, if approved by the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting, will also be added to the total number of Shares which may be allotted and issued under the General Mandate as mentioned in the ordinary resolution no. 5(A) as stated in the Notice provided that such additional amount shall not exceed 10 per cent of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the General Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate. The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to issue any new Shares pursuant to the General Mandate.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with article 16.2 of the Articles of Association, Ms. Yip Lee Ying who was appointed as an executive Director by the Board with effect from 28 August 2020 shall hold office until the Annual General Meeting. She, being eligible, will offer herself for re-election as Director at the Annual General Meeting.

In accordance with article 16.18 of the Articles of Association, at every annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest to, but not less than, one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years. Any Director appointed pursuant to article 16.2 or article 16.3 of the Articles of Association shall not be taken into account in determining which Directors are to retire by rotation. Ms. Jin Xiaoqin, being an executive Director, and Mr. Man Yiu Kwong, Nick, being an independent non-executive Director, both being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

The independent non-executive Director proposed for re-election was identified by the management after having taken into account the skills and experience of the candidate. Mr. Man Yiu Kwong, Nick is an independent non-executive Director who has served on the Board for more than five years. Mr. Man has satisfied all the criteria for independence set out in rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and provided annual confirmation of independence to the Company. Mr. Man's independence has also been assessed by the Nomination Committee and considered to be independent. Mr. Man is an associate member of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and a fellow member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants with extensive accounting and corporate financial expertise and experience. The Board considered that the re-election of Mr. Man will form a balanced skill matrix beneficial to the Group's corporate governance as well as business development and thereby contribute to the diversity of the Board.

Upon the recommendation and nomination of the Nomination Committee, the Board has recommended that Ms. Jin Xiaoqin and Ms. Yip Lee Ying to stand for re-election as an executive Director and Mr. Man Yiu Kwong, Nick to stand for re-election as an independent non-executive Director.

Details of the above named Directors who are subject to re-election at the Annual General Meeting are set out in Appendix I to this circular in accordance with the relevant requirements of the Listing Rules.

DECLARATION OF FINAL DIVIDEND AND SPECIAL DIVIDEND AND CLOSURE OF REGISTER OF MEMBERS

Proposed final dividend and special dividend

As mentioned in the final results announcement of the Company dated 30 March 2021, the Board recommended a final dividend of HK6.4 cents per Share and a special dividend of HK3.2 cents per Share in respect of the year ended 31 December 2020, totalling HK\$25,600,000 and HK\$12,800,000, respectively, which are subject to the approval of Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting.

The final dividend and special dividend, if approved by the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting, will be paid on or about Friday, 25 June, 2021, to Shareholders whose names appear on the register of members of the Company on Thursday, 10 June 2021.

Save as disclosed herein and to the best knowledge of the Company, none of the following Directors holds any position with the Company or any other member of the Group, nor has any directorships in other listed public companies in the last three years. In addition, save as disclosed herein, none of the following Directors has any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial Shareholders or controlling Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Save as disclosed in this circular and to the best knowledge of the Company, there is no other matter in relation to the following Directors that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders and there is no other information relating to the following Directors which is required to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rules 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules.

Director candidates

Ms. Yip Lee Ying (葉莉盈), aged 37, was appointed as an executive Director on 28 August 2020. Ms. Yip joined the Group in February 2016 as chief financial officer and has also been appointed as the company secretary of the Company. Ms. Yip is principally responsible for overseeing the Group's financial management, internal control, company secretarial and corporate finance matters. Ms. Yip has over 10 years of experience in professional accounting and financial advisory services. Prior to joining the Group, Ms. Yip worked at Deloitte Hong Kong from February 2007 to January 2016 and her last position held was Associate Director at Deloitte Advisory (Hong Kong) Limited. Ms. Yip is a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. She holds a Bachelor of Commerce degree in Accounting and Finance and a Master of Commerce degree in Funds Management from the University of New South Wales.

Ms. Yip has entered a letter of appointment with the Company in relation to her appointment as an executive Director for an initial term of three years commencing on 28 August 2020, unless terminated by either party in accordance with the terms thereof. Ms. Yip's appointment is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meeting in accordance with the articles of association of the Company. Ms. Yip is entitled to a fixed annual salary of HK\$1,346,400 plus a performance-related discretionary bonus pursuant to her contract of employment with the Group. The contract of employment entered into between Ms. Yip and the Group has no fixed term, but may be terminated by either party giving one month's written notice or payment in lieu. Ms. Yip's emoluments were determined by the Board having taken into consideration of the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Company with reference to the prevailing market situation, her experience and her duties and responsibilities with the Group. Such emoluments are subject to review by the Board from time to time pursuant to the power conferred on it in the annual general meeting of the Company

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Yip did not have any interest in any Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance.

APPENDIX I

PARTICULARS OF THE DIRECTORS PROPOSED FOR RE-ELECTION AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Ms. Jin Xiaoqin (金曉琴), aged 64, was appointed as Director on 9 April 2014 and designated as an executive Director on 24 July 2014. Ms. Jin is a co-founder of the Group and an experienced property investor. Between July 2006 and July 2008 she was the director of a privately held company in Hong Kong which, through its subsidiaries, was engaged in motorcycle manufacturing and trading business in the PRC. She is responsible for the overall management of the Group's business and operations and participating in monitoring of the Group's treasury functions, including the allocation of funds for the purpose of running the Group's daily business operation. Ms. Jin is the mother of Ms. Wang Yao.

Ms. Jin has entered into a service agreement with the Company regarding her appointment as an executive Director for a term of three years commencing from 22 November 2014 and shall continue thereafter unless terminated by not less than six months' written notice or otherwise in accordance with the service agreement subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years. According to the terms of the service agreement, she will receive a monthly salary of HK\$50,000, which is subject to annual review by the Board and the remuneration committee of the Board. She is also entitled to a discretionary performance bonus as may be determined by the Board upon the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Board.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Jin was deemed to be interested in 300,000,000 Shares, held through her wholly-owned company, Blossom Spring Global Limited, within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance.

Mr. Man Yiu Kwong, Nick (文耀光), aged 51, was appointed as an independent non-executive Director with effect from 1 January 2016. Mr. Man is currently the managing director of the investment banking department of Guosen Securities (HK) Capital Co., Ltd.. Mr. Man has over 10 years of experience in the corporate finance field. Mr. Man obtained a Bachelor's Degree of Business Administration from Simon Fraser University, Canada in October 1993. He has been an associate member of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants since January 2000 and a fellow member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants since September 2003.

Mr. Man has signed a letter of appointment with the Company for a term of three years commencing from 1 January 2019, unless otherwise terminated in accordance with the letter of appointment and subject to retirement at least once every three years. Pursuant to the terms of the letter of appointment, Mr. Man will be entitled to receive an annual fee of HK\$240,000. Mr. Man's fee as an independent non-executive Director was determined by the remuneration committee of the Board with reference to his experience, responsibility, workload and the time to be devoted to the Group and is subject to the review of the remuneration committee of the Board from time to time.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Man did not have any interest in any Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance

The following is an explanatory statement required to be sent to the Shareholders under the Listing Rules in connection with the proposed Repurchase Mandate.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 400,000,000 Shares of nominal value of HK\$0.01 each. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased after the Latest Practicable Date up to the date of the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 40,000,000 Shares which represents 10 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company during the period commencing from the passing of the relevant resolution as stated in the Notice and ending on the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by Cayman Companies Law or the Articles of Association; or (iii) the date upon which such authority to repurchase is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company.

REASONS FOR AND FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole to seek a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchase(s) may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the Group's net asset value per Share and/or its earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchase(s) will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

Repurchases of Shares will be financed out of funds legally available for such purposes in accordance with the Articles of Association, the Cayman Companies Law and the Listing Rules. The Cayman Companies Law provides that the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may be paid out of the profits of the Company or the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose of the repurchase or out of capital subject to and in accordance with the Cayman Companies Law. The amount of premium payable on repurchase may only be paid out of either the profits of the Company or from sums standing to the credit of the share premium account of the Company.

The Directors have no present intention to repurchase any Shares and they would only exercise the power to repurchase in circumstances where they consider that the repurchase would be in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. The Directors consider that if the Repurchase Mandate was to be exercised in full at the current prevailing market value, it may have a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or the gearing position of the Company, as compared with the positions disclosed in the audited consolidated financial statements of the Company as at 31 December 2020, being the date to which the latest published audited consolidated financial statements of the Company were made up. The Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as it would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

GENERAL

To the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors or any of their close associates, as defined in the Listing Rules, currently intend to sell any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will only exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and the Articles of Association.

The Company is prohibited from knowingly purchasing securities on the Stock Exchange from a core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) and a core connected person is prohibited from knowingly selling his/her/its securities to the Company.

No core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that he/she has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is exercised.

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of his/her/their interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. Save as aforesaid, the Directors are not aware of any consequences which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchase of Shares pursuant to the proposed Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge and belief of the Directors, Blossom Spring Global Limited, which is wholly owned by Ms. Jin Xiaoqin, an executive Director, was interested in 75 per cent of the existing issued share capital of the Company. For illustration purpose only, if the Directors exercise in full the Repurchase Mandate, the shareholding of Blossom Spring Global Limited in the Company would be increased to approximately 83.33 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company. To the best knowledge and belief of the Directors, such increase would not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code.
