1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to give you notice of the AGM and to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to: (i) the adoption of the audited consolidated financial statements of the Company and the reports of Directors and Auditors for the year ended 31 December 2022; (ii) the re-election of

retiring Directors; (iii) the re-appointment of the Auditors; (iv) the granting of the General Mandates to issue and repurchase Shares; (v) the extension of the Issue Mandate; and (vi) the proposed adoption of the Restated and Amended Memorandum and Articles of Association.

2. ADOPTION OF THE AUDITED CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND THE REPORTS OF THE DIRECTORS AND THE AUDITORS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

The audited consolidated financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2022 together with the reports of the Directors and the Auditors, are set out in the 2022 Annual Report which will be sent to the Shareholders together with this circular. The 2022 Annual Report may be viewed and downloaded from the Company's website (www.dfport.com.hk) and the Hong Kong Exchanges and Clearing Limited's website (www.hkexnews.hk).

The consolidated financial statements have been audited by Mazars CPA Limited and reviewed by the Audit Committee. The report of the Auditors is set out on pages 115 to 122 of the 2022 Annual Report.

3. RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Article 83(3) of the Articles, any Director appointed by the Board to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office until the first general meeting of members after his appointment and be subject to re-election at such meeting and any Director appointed by the Board as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 84(1) of the Articles, notwithstanding any other provisions in the Articles, at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at an annual general meeting at least once every three years.

In accordance with Article 83(3) of the Articles, Mr. Zhao Liang ("**Mr. Zhao**") as an executive Director and Mr. Zhang Shukai ("**Mr. Zhang**") as a non-executive Director will hold office until the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

In accordance with Article 84(1) of the Articles, Dr. Bian Zhaoxiang ("**Dr. Bian**") and Mr. Yu Xugang ("**Mr. Yu**") as independent non-executive Directors will retire from office by rotation at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

The re-election of Directors has been reviewed by the Nomination Committee which recommended to the Board that the re-election be proposed for Shareholders' approval at the AGM. The nominations were made in accordance with the Nomination Policy of the Company and the objective criteria for the nominations including but not limited to, race,

gender, age, cultural and educational background, professional qualification, skills, knowledge, industry experience and length of service, with due regard for the benefits of diversity as set out under the Board Diversity Policy of the Company.

The Nomination Committee considered that in view of the nominees' diverse and different educational backgrounds and professional knowledge and experience in the respective fields of business management, sales and marketing as set out in Appendix I to this circular, the appointment of Mr. Zhao, Mr. Zhang, Dr. Bian and Mr. Yu as Directors will bring valuable perspectives, knowledge, skills and experiences to the Board for its efficient and effective functioning and their appointments will contribute to the diversity of the Board appropriate to the requirements of the Company's business.

In determining the proposed re-election of Dr. Bian and Mr. Yu as independent non-executive Directors, the Nomination Committee has also assessed and reviewed the independent non-executive Director's annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 5.09 to the GEM Listing Rules and is satisfied of independence of Dr. Bian and Mr. Yu.

Details of the above retiring Directors who are subject to re-election at the AGM are set out in Appendix I to this circular in accordance with the relevant requirements of the GEM Listing Rules.

4. RE-APPOINTMENT OF THE AUDITORS

Mazars CPA Limited will retire as the Auditors at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-appointment.

The Board, upon the recommendation of the Audit Committee, proposed to re-appoint Mazars CPA Limited as the Auditors and to hold office until the conclusion of the 2024 annual general meeting of the Company.

5. GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 19 May 2022, the Directors were granted a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares (the "**2022 General Mandate**"). The 2022 General Mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM.

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to grant to the Directors a new general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and otherwise deal with the Shares representing up to 20% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of the passing of the proposed resolution.

The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Issue Mandate (if granted to the Directors at the AGM).

The Issue Mandate allows the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with the Shares only during the period ending on the earliest of (i) conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by the Articles or the laws of the Cayman Islands; or (iii) the date upon which such authority is revoked, renewed or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company (the “**Relevant Period**”).

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,288,000,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the relevant resolution to approve the Issue Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be allotted and issued or repurchased prior to the date of the AGM, the Directors would be authorised to allot, issue and otherwise deal with a maximum of 257,600,000 Shares under the Issue Mandate, representing 20% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of the AGM.

6. GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

The Company’s existing mandate to repurchase Shares (the “**Existing Repurchase Mandate**”) was approved by the Shareholders at the annual general meeting held on 19 May 2022. The Existing Repurchase Mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM.

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to grant to the Directors a new general and unconditional mandate to repurchase Shares representing up to 10% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of the passing of the proposed resolution. The Repurchase Mandate allows the Company to make purchases only during the Relevant Period.

The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate (if granted to the Directors at the AGM).

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,288,000,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the relevant resolution to approve the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be allotted and issued or repurchased prior to the date of the AGM, the Company would be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 128,800,000 Shares under the Repurchase Mandate, representing 10% of the aggregate number of Shares in issue as at the date of the AGM.

An explanatory statement required to be sent to the Shareholders under the GEM Listing Rules is set out in Appendix II to this circular to provide the Shareholders with the necessary information regarding the Repurchase Mandate.

7. EXTENSION OF ISSUE MANDATE

Conditional upon the passing of the resolution to grant the General Mandates, a separate ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM to extend the Issue Mandate by including the number of Shares repurchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate.

8. CLOSURE OF THE REGISTER OF MEMBERS

The 2023 AGM will be held on Thursday, 18 May 2023 at 3:00 p.m. In order to ascertain the entitlement of Shareholders to attend and vote at the AGM, the register of members of the Company will be closed from Monday, 15 May 2023 to Thursday, 18 May 2023, both days inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered. In order to be eligible to attend and vote at the AGM, all transfer documents accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong, for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, 12 May 2023.

9. PROPOSED ADOPTION OF THE AMENDED AND RESTATED MEMORANDUM AND ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Reference is made to the announcement of the Company dated 23 March 2023 in relation to the proposed amendments to the Memorandum and Articles and adoption of the Amended and Restated Memorandum and Articles.

The Board proposes that certain amendments be made to the existing Memorandum and Articles by adopting a new Memorandum and Articles in substitution for, and to the exclusion of, the existing Memorandum and Articles to, among others, (i) bring the constitutional documents of the Company in line with the amendments made to the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and the GEM Listing Rules; and (ii) introduce corresponding and house-keeping changes.

The full text of the Proposed Amendments is set out in Appendix III to this circular. The Chinese translation of the proposed Amended and Restated Memorandum and Articles is for reference only. In case of any discrepancy or inconsistency between the English version and its Chinese translation, the English version shall prevail.

The Company has been advised by its legal advisers as to Hong Kong laws and the laws of the Cayman Islands that the proposed amendments to the existing Memorandum and Articles conform with the requirements of the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands, respectively. The Company also confirms that there is nothing unusual about the proposed Amended and Restated Memorandum and Articles for a company listed in Hong Kong.

The Board proposes to put forward to the Shareholders for approval at the AGM a special resolution to adopt the Amended and Restated Memorandum and Articles in substitution for, and to the exclusion of, the existing Memorandum and Articles, and the proposed adoption of the Amended and Restated Memorandum and Articles is subject to the passing of such special resolution. Prior to the passing of the special resolution at the AGM, the existing Memorandum and Articles shall remain valid.

10. AGM

A notice convening the AGM is set out on pages 74 to 78 of this circular. The AGM will be held at 14/F, Fairmont House, 8 Cotton Tree Drive, Central, Hong Kong on Thursday, 18 May 2023 at 3:00 p.m. for the purpose of considering and, if thought fit, approving the resolutions as set out therein. According to Rule 17.47(4) of the GEM Listing Rules, the voting at the AGM will be taken by poll.

A form of proxy for use at the AGM is also enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you are able to attend the meeting, you are requested to complete the accompanying form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return the same to the branch share registrar of the Company in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong, as soon as possible, and in any event not later than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy shall not preclude the Shareholders from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof if they so wish. If the Shareholder attends and votes at the AGM, the instrument appointing the proxy will be deemed to have been revoked.

11. RESPONSIBILITY OF THE DIRECTORS

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that, to the best of their knowledge and belief, the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters or omissions of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

12. RECOMMENDATION

The Board considers that the proposed resolutions in relation to (i) the adoption of audited consolidated financial statements of the Company and the reports of Directors and Auditors of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2022; (ii) the re-election of retiring Directors; (iii) the re-appointment of Auditors; (iv) the granting of the General Mandates; (v) the extension of the Issue Mandate; and (vi) the proposed adoption of the Restated and Amended Memorandum and Articles of Association are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Board recommends the Shareholders vote in favour of all the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

The biographical details of the retiring Directors eligible for re-election at the AGM are set out as follows:

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mr. Zhao Liang (“**Mr. Zhao**”), aged 35, was appointed as an executive Director and chairman of the Board on 27 May 2022. Mr. Zhao has served as the assistant to general manager of 江蘇鹽城港大豐港開發集團有限公司 (Jiangsu Yancheng Port Dafeng Port Development Group Co., Ltd*) (formerly known as 江蘇大豐海港控股集團有限公司 (Jiangsu Dafeng Harbour Holdings Limited*)) (“**Dafeng Port Development Group**”) and the general manager of 江蘇鹽城港港航國際貿易有限公司 (Jiangsu Yancheng Port Shipping International Trading Co., Limited*) (formerly known as 鹽城大豐港和順國際貿易有限公司 (Yancheng Dafeng Port Heshun International Trading Company Limited*)) (“**Heshun Trading**”), a indirectly wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company since May 2022. He has also served as a director and deputy chairman of 江蘇悅達新能源科技發展有限公司 (Jiangsu Yueda New Energy Technology Development Co., Ltd.*), a connected company which is owned as to 30% by 江蘇鹽城港控股集團有限公司 (Jiangsu Yancheng Port Holding Group Co., Ltd*) (“**Jiangsu Yancheng**”), a controlling shareholder of the Company which wholly-owns Dafeng Port Development Group, since April 2022. Between January 2021 and May 2022, Mr. Zhao successively held various positions in the group of companies of Jiangsu Yancheng. Mr. Zhao obtained a bachelor degree in Chinese language and literature (online course) at the Southwest University of Science of Technology (西南科技大學) in July 2017 and a bachelor degree in electrical engineering and automation at the Yancheng Institute of Technology (鹽城工學院) in June 2010.

Mr. Zhao has entered into a service contract with the Company as an executive Director for an initial term of three years commencing from 27 May 2022, subject to termination in certain circumstances as stipulated in his service contract or unless and until terminated by either party giving to the other not less than three (3) months’ prior written notice at any time during the term. Mr. Zhao has voluntarily undertook to the Company to forfeit any and all remuneration to be received in respect for his posts and services to the Company. His appointment is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles.

Save as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Zhao did not (1) hold any positions in other members of the Group; (2) hold any directorship in listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas during the past three years; (3) hold other major appointments and professional qualifications; (4) have any relationships with any other Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company; and (5) have any interest in the Shares, underlying Shares or debentures of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO and he is not aware of any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Save as disclosed above, the Company considers that in relation to the re-election of Mr. Zhao as an executive Director, there is no other information that should be disclosed pursuant to Rule 17.50(2) of the GEM Listing Rules and there are no other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

Mr. Zhang Shukai (“**Mr. Zhang**”), aged 25, was appointed a non-executive Director on 11 January 2023. Mr. Zhang has served as the deputy general manager of Dafeng Port Development Group since September 2022. Between January 2021 and September 2022, Mr. Zhang worked at Jiangsu Yancheng, with his last position as an assistant minister of the investment and financing department. Mr. Zhang obtained a master degree in international finance from the University of Glasgow in December 2020. In July 2019, Mr. Zhang obtained a bachelor degree in computer technology and network from the University of Hertfordshire.

Mr. Zhang has entered into a service contract with the Company as a non-executive Director for an initial term of three years commencing on 11 January 2023, subject to termination in certain circumstances as stipulated in his service contract. His appointment shall be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles.

Under the said service contract, Mr. Zhang is entitled to an annual director’s fee of HK\$240,000, which was determined with reference to his duties and responsibilities within the Group. Mr. Zhang has voluntarily undertook to the Company to forfeit any and all remuneration to be received in respect for his posts and services to the Company.

GEM LISTING RULES RELATING TO PURCHASE OF SHARES

The GEM Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listing is on the Stock Exchange to repurchase shares on the Stock Exchange and any other stock exchange on which securities of the company are listed and such exchange is recognised by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong subject to certain restrictions. Among such restrictions, the GEM Listing Rules provide that the shares of such company must be fully paid up and all repurchases of shares by such company must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of shareholders, either by way of a general mandate or by specific approval of a particular transaction.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 1,288,000,000. Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 128,800,000 Shares, being 10% of the entire issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole for the Company to have general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase the Shares in the market. may also be made out of the capital of the Company. Repurchase to be made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be financed out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

IMPACT OF REPURCHASE

Taking into account the current working capital position of the Group, the Directors consider that, if the Repurchase Mandate was to be exercised in full, it might have a material adverse effect on the working capital and/or the gearing position of the Group as compared with the position as at 31 December 2022, being the date of the Company's latest published audited consolidated financial statements. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Group or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Group.

DIRECTORS' INTENTION TO SELL SHARES

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates currently intends to sell Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries.

DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

CONNECTED PARTIES

The GEM Listing Rules prohibit a company from knowingly purchasing securities on GEM from a core connected person, that is, a Director, chief executive or substantial Shareholder of the Company or any of its subsidiaries or their respective close associates, and a core connected person is prohibited from knowingly selling his/her/its securities of the Company to the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, no core connected person has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If, as a result of a securities repurchase pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (as defined in the Takeovers Code) could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and may become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code and the provision may apply as a result of any such increase. The Directors are not aware of any consequences of repurchase which would arise under the Takeovers Code.

If an amendment is proposed to any resolution under consideration but is in good faith ruled out of order by the chairman of the meeting, the proceedings on the substantive resolution shall not be invalidated by any error in such ruling. In the case of a resolution duly proposed as a special resolution, no amendment thereto (other than a mere clerical amendment to correct a patent error) may in any event be considered or voted upon.
63. (1) The chairman of the Company or if there is more than one chairman, any one of them as may be agreed amongst themselves or failing such agreement, any one of them elected by all the Directors present shall preside as chairman at every a general meeting. 64H. Without prejudice to Articles 64A to 64G, and subject to the Statutes and the Listing Rules and any other applicable laws, the Board may resolve to enable persons entitled to attend an electronic meeting to do so by simultaneous attendance by means of electronic facilities with no Member necessarily in physical attendance and without any particular Meeting Location being designated. The Company may also impose any conditions on the transmission of and its receipt of such electronic communications including, for the avoidance of doubt, imposing any security or encryption arrangements as may be specified by the Company. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

83. (2) Subject to the Articles and the Law, the Company may by ordinary resolution elect any person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy on the Board, or as an addition to the existing Board.

(3) The Directors shall have the power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy on the Board or as an addition to the existing Board. Any Director appointed by the Board to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office until the first general meeting of Members after his appointment and be subject to re-election at such meeting and any Director appointed by the Board as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election.

(5) The Members may, at any general meeting convened and held in accordance with these Articles, by ordinary resolution remove a Director at any time before the expiration of his period of office notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Articles or in any agreement between the Company and such Director (but without prejudice to any claim for damages under any such agreement).

- (6) In order to ascertain the entitlement of Shareholders to attend and vote at the AGM, the register of members of the Company will be closed from Monday, 15 May 2023 to Thursday, 18 May 2023, both days inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered. In order to be eligible to attend and vote at the AGM, all transfer documents accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong, for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, 12 May 2023.
